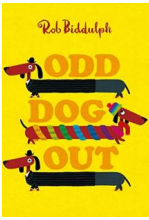

by JaNay Brown-Wood

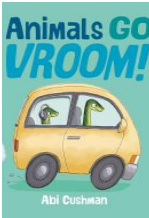

by Lucy Cousins

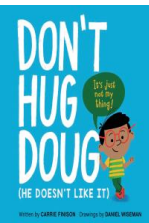

by Abi Cushman

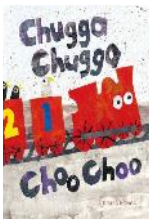
Strategically placed die-cuts provide clues for readers searching for the noisemakers--and troublemakers--on a very busy street!

by Emma Garcia

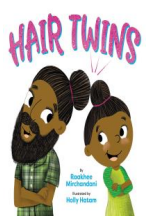
A little red train goes on a trip from the seaside to the forest, the city, the farm, and finally the station for a rest, where it is visited by a bunch of noisy birds.

by Jane Godwin

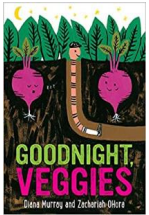
In this rhyming story, a young mouse makes her way around the world, introducing colors.

Picture Books Wen - *Hello Hello*

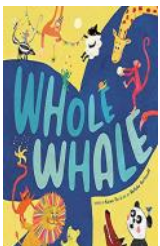
by Brendan Wenzel
